2019 Parent Opinion Survey

A big thank you to the 50 or so families who have completed the 2019 Parent Opinion Survey to date.

Two hundred and forty survey links were randomly distributed to Willy North families approximately two weeks ago as part of this state-wide survey in Victorian Government Schools.

For our school's sample size, we require a response rate in excess of 50% (120 families) to ensure the feedback received is statistically reliable and valid.

2020 Foundation Enrolments

At the end of last week we received a small rush of 2020 Foundation Enrolments, with the school now having received just over 80 applications for enrolment into Foundation next year. As previously mentioned, the school is currently planning for four classes at this level in 2020 (pending any major changes over the next several weeks).

Reminder – Car Park Safety

We seek the support of all families to be vigilant when arriving at school between 8:45am – 9:00am, and when leaving between 3:30pm and 3:45pm, to ensure the heightened safety for all students during these peak times. We have several staff rostered on yard supervision during these times, with a particular focus on monitoring the major entrance/exit points into/out of the school.

If you are entering/leaving the school on Station Road, we ask that you take particular care to use the double gates located on the footpath opposite the crossing. Under no circumstances should students or adults be cutting through the driveway entrance to the carpark to enter or leave the school, as it is very difficult for drivers to have visibility of smaller children in this area and we will need to be setting the correct example.

We have been very fortunate to have had no serious safety incidents for many years now and so look forward to continuing to work closely with all families during these busy times in the school day.

Our annual Reading & Writing Together is Magic is scheduled for Wednesday 28th August at 6:30pm, as part of this year's Book Week celebrations.

On Tuesday 27th August we are looking forward to all students coming to school dressed as their favourite book character or character from a movie which has originated from a book. There will be a parade on Tasmania (weather permitting) at 9:15am for the whole school to participate in and share their costumes.

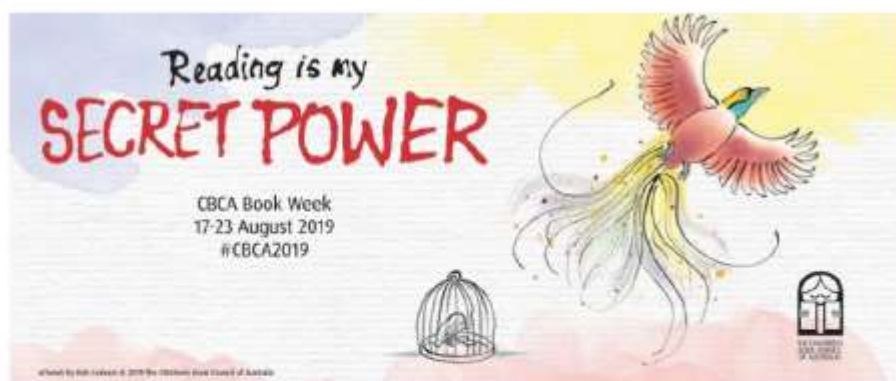
Microphones were introduced last year to support the students presentations and will again be used this year.

Early Release

All children collected from school before 3.30pm must be signed out at the Office. With an 'Early Release Pass' to hand to the supervising teacher. If a child is signed out at Recess or Lunch time, your child will be called to the Office and the Early Release Pass will be given to the supervising teacher.

Student Safety

Please take the time to regularly remind your child/ren about safety, especially when going to and from school.

- Do not talk to strangers and never accept a ride, lollies or gifts from a stranger.
- Immediately report any issue or problem you may have when going to or from school, to your mum and dad, or your teacher, the Principal, Assistant Principal or office staff.
- Always get permission from mum or dad before going to play with a friend after school and always let mum and dad know where you will be and what time you will be home.

We advise that wherever possible, children should travel to or from school with an adult or friends, rather than travel alone.

Working With Children Cards

Cardholders who are required to renew their WWCC will no longer need to go to Australia Post to lodge a paper form and present their current card. Cardholders will go to the WWCC website to complete their renewal application online and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the fee using a credit card when using the **online renewal process**, cardholders will be notified by SMS, letter or email 28 days before their WWCC is due to expire. It is important for cardholders to keep their contact details up to date so that they receive this important reminder.

After receiving a notification, individuals continuing to do child-related work should go to MyCheck on the WWCC website and apply to renew their check. Cardholders will be asked to register with MyCheck if they have not already done so. Once logged in to MyCheck, cardholders will be prompted to confirm or update their personal contact and work details, complete the online form and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the non-refundable fee.

Bikes & Scooters

Many children ride bikes and scooters to school each day. All bikes and scooters must be locked up in either the Bike or Scooter Enclosure to prevent theft. Please ensure your child has a chain and a lock.

All children who ride a bike or scooter must wear a helmet which is a requirement by the Government. The school regularly reminds all children about wearing helmets for their safety.

All bikes, scooters, skateboards, ribstic and helmets must be labelled, with your child's name and class. **Children are reminded they must walk their bike, scooter, skateboard or ribstic to and from the school gates. No bikes are to be brought through the school buildings and we request, where possible, that scooters are also not walked through the building.**



RUN FOR POVERTY—UPDATE

Thank you to the school community for supporting my Run from Poverty experience. The funds raised (\$897.75) help orphaned and abandoned children, 77 in Kenya and 50 in Uganda. One Heart Foundation provides them with a home and education, both key to helping to break the poverty cycle.

The Run from Poverty experience is truly life changing. We visited the One Heart villages in Kenya and Uganda. Spending time with the kids, seeing firsthand the impact our contributions are having. What was apparent was how happy the kids are and how they aspire to big things in life. Truly inspiring when you understand the struggles they have endured.

We visited a local children's rescue centre, and had a fantastic morning at Shoe 4 Africa children's hospital, one of only three Children's Hospitals in East Africa. Playing the Kenyan version of duck, duck, goose with the kids was great.

Many of us then completed a marathon, covering 42.2km at an altitude of 1800m, with many hills and the hot African sun to contend with. Finishing at the Kenyan village to the applause of all the kids. A true mental and physical challenge, but a moment to be remembered forever, and worth every bit of pain; all for the kids.

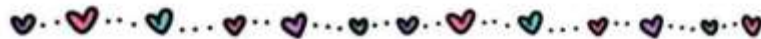
