Principal's Report

- Liaise with the classroom teacher prior to the excursion to clarify the level of support needed. (General participation, in charge of a group/activity etc.).
- Try to quickly learn the names of the students in the group that you have been assigned (if your child happens to be in this same group, be conscious of sharing your support equitably with all students in the group)

and not displaying preferential treatment to your child).

- If by chance a child requires first aid or appears unwell, please liaise directly with that relevant classroom teacher.
- If possible, please try to refrain from answering mobile phone calls or checking text messages/emails, which could potentially distract you from your duty of care.
- We ask that parents do not purchase food or gifts for their group, or their own child. (Whilst we understand the generous intention of this, it can create tensions with other students/groups who may feel that they have 'been overlooked'.)
- Be conscious that any photography on the day must only be of group shots. (No individual close up shots can be taken of students as per our Privacy Policy).
- You may notice students with additional needs, challenging behaviours or children functioning at different developmental stages; we ask that you refrain from sharing information/observations about these students with any other adults, in the interest of being respectful and inclusive.

We hope this brief list helps to clarify the role of parents on excursions. The general rule of thumb however is that if you are ever unsure about a situation when on an excursion, simply liaise with the classroom teacher so that this matter can be discussed.

We also seek your understanding in regards to those parents who are not selected to help out on an excursion. We do try very hard to ensure this experience is shared amongst all parents over time. Conversely, it is also not appropriate to attend an excursion by choice as a parent, as this can complicate many organisational aspects of the excursion.

Privacy Policy

All government schools in Victoria are required to adopt the Department of Education & Training's standardised Schools' Privacy Policy. This has recently been updated and made available to all schools.

The Schools' Privacy Policy informs the school community that information about students can be shared to fulfil the schools' core functions of educating and supporting our students.

The Schools' Privacy Policy establishes a clarified 'need to know' framework, where school staff share information about students with other staff who need to know as part of their role. This is consistent with Victorian privacy law.

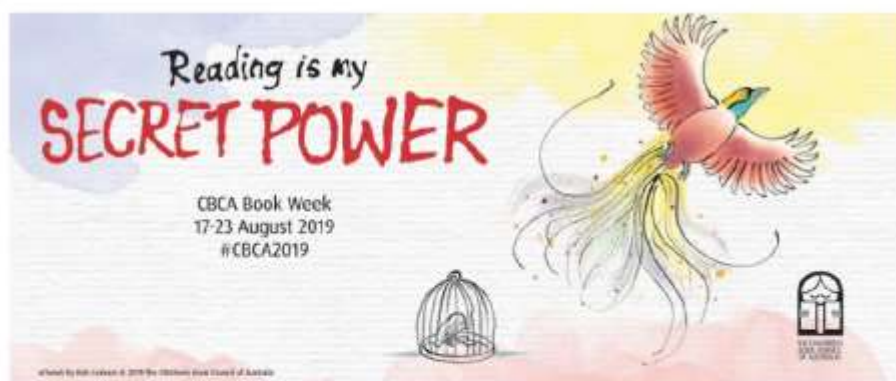
Microphones were introduced last year to support the students presentations and will again be used this year.

Early Release

All children collected from school before 3.30pm must be signed out at the Office. With an 'Early Release Pass' to hand to the supervising teacher. If a child is signed out at Recess or Lunch time, your child will be called to the Office and the Early Release Pass will be given to the supervising teacher.

Student Safety

Please take the time to regularly remind your child/ren about safety, especially when going to and from school.

- Do not talk to strangers and never accept a ride, lollies or gifts from a stranger.
- Immediately report any issue or problem you may have when going to or from school, to your mum and dad, or your teacher, the Principal, Assistant Principal or office staff.
- Always get permission from mum or dad before going to play with a friend after school and always let mum and dad know where you will be and what time you will be home.

We advise that wherever possible, children should travel to or from school with an adult or friends, rather than travel alone.

Working With Children Cards

Cardholders who are required to renew their WWCC will no longer need to go to Australia Post to lodge a paper form and present their current card. Cardholders will go to the WWCC website to complete their renewal application online and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the fee using a credit card when using the **online renewal process**, cardholders will be notified by SMS, letter or email 28 days before their WWCC is due to expire. It is important for cardholders to keep their contact details up to date so that they receive this important reminder.

After receiving a notification, individuals continuing to do child-related work should go to MyCheck on the WWCC website and apply to renew their check. Cardholders will be asked to register with MyCheck if they have not already done so. Once logged in to MyCheck, cardholders will be prompted to confirm or update their personal contact and work details, complete the online form and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the non-refundable fee.

Bikes & Scooters

Many children ride bikes and scooters to school each day. All bikes and scooters must be locked up in either the Bike or Scooter Enclosure to prevent theft. Please ensure your child has a chain and a lock.

All children who ride a bike or scooter must wear a helmet which is a requirement by the Government. The school regularly reminds all children about wearing helmets for their safety.

All bikes, scooters, skateboards, ribstic and helmets must be labelled, with your child's name and class. **Children are reminded they must walk their bike, scooter, skateboard or ribstic to and from the school gates. No bikes are to be brought through the school buildings and we request, where possible, that scooters are also not walked through the building.**

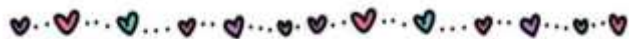

My name is Jessica Coote and I am a 4th year university student at the Australian National University in Canberra. This is quite a peculiar email but I hope you will indulge me, and I wasn't quite sure who to email so I apologise that its probably gone to too many people! I recently had the opportunity to visit Gallipoli and the Western Front on an ANZAC study tour with the ANU. During this trip we were given a collection of small wooden remembrance crosses which had messages from Australian school children on them, and were able to lay these at various headstones and cemeteries around Europe. The cross I was given was written by a student from Williamstown North Primary School. I wanted to reach out to share where the cross has been-laid, and share some photos. The cemetery was at Polygon Wood, and at the memorial for the Fifth Australian Division. Polygon Wood is a small forest located about four miles east of the Belgium town of Ypres. The cemetery is quite large, however of the 2,109 bodies buried within its confines, only 433 are identified, and thus most are buried under the epitaph 'known unto god'. I decided to lay the cross from your student at a headstone of 'an Australian soldier of the Great War' - an unidentified man but one who fought and died for the freedom we enjoy back here at home.

Unfortunately there was no name on the cross from your school, but I hope with the help of your students and staff you will be able to find the student. I remember when I was a student in school I filled out an almost identical cross, and felt a responsibility to carry on this tradition. I hope you can find student, or at least carry on the tradition of letting your students write them - I can confirm they actually do make it to Europe!

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
