Principal's Report

2020 Parent Payments

After extensive consideration at our last Facilities & Finance sub-committee meeting of School Council, we're delighted to confirm that there will be **NO INCREASES** to any of Parent Payments in 2020.

The total cost of all charges and payments will therefore remain at \$550 for the entire 2020 academic year.

This amount includes all classroom requisites that your child will need, which the school will purchase on your behalf and have ready for each child on the first day of school next year. It will also include all Excursions/Incursions for the year, as well as daily access to a registered nurse (Olivia) in the Health Hub and computer technician (Tinh) across the school. This amount will also ensure every child has access to the Fresh Fruit Friday program every Friday as well as ensuring that our grounds are maintained to a high level (note, we will spend almost \$10,000 on soft fall mulch over the Xmas break to ensure all of our playgrounds are safe and compliant!).

You can certainly be assured that the total charge of \$550 will be used very prudently to facilitate an outstanding learning environment for each child again in 2020. The only other charges throughout the year that you may incur will be for participation in the school's camping program, swimming and sporting events as well as any end of year celebration activities.

As the school has already begun incurring set up costs for next year, we would be very grateful to families who are able to make these payments over the next several weeks. This will ensure that your child will be equipped with their full book pack on the first day of the school year next January.

All payment details and arrangements will be provided in the letter you will receive at your home address either later this week, or early next week. If you have any queries regarding any of these payments, please don't hesitate to make contact with the school. We thank you in anticipation of your support on this important matter.

2020 Grade Structure

As part of our strong collaborative processes at Willy North, extensive consultation has been undertaken over recent weeks with teachers to compose the class structure for next year, with the learning needs of our students at each of these levels being the prime consideration. Pending any major fluctuations to these numbers, we feel this structure has achieved a good balance given the school's financial constraints associated with such a deeply experienced staffing profile.

At this stage, we are proceeding with planning for a thirty-three grade structure to accommodate all of next year's students (we currently have 32 classes operating in 2019). The following structure provides an indication of the number of classes at each level with an estimation of the expected number of students in each class:

- * Foundation – 101 students across 5 classes (20/21 students @ class)
- * Year 1 – 88 students across 4 classes (22 students @ class)
- * Year 2 – 121 students across 5 classes (24/25 students @ class)
- * Year 3 - 106 students across 5 classes (21/22 students @ class)
- * Year 4 – 127 students across 5 classes (25/26 students @ class)
- * Year 5 – 138 students across 5 classes (28 students @ class)
- * Year 6 – 109 students across 4 classes (27/28 students @ class)

If there are any changes to this structure over the coming weeks, I will provide an update through the newsletter.

As the school's recruitment processes for 2020 continue to unfold, we are not in a position to confirm the teaching staff at each level at this stage. We hope to be able to publish this in early December.

Projected Enrolments

A big thank you to the parents who have maintained communication with the school over recent weeks in regards to enrolment plans for next year. We understand that changes to employment such as a posting interstate or overseas, might not be confirmed until very late in the year, along with unforeseen changes to family circumstances which are hard to anticipate.

To help support our planning structures for next year, we would be grateful if you could keep the school informed of any changes that might impact on your child's enrolment at Willy North next year.

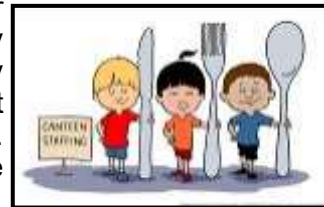

Early Release

All children collected from school before 3.30pm must be signed out at the Office. With an 'Early Release Pass' to hand to the supervising teacher. If a child is signed out at Recess or Lunch time, your child will be called to the Office and the Early Release Pass will be given to the supervising teacher.

Student Safety

Please take the time to regularly remind your child/ren about safety, especially when going to and from school.

- Do not talk to strangers and never accept a ride, lollies or gifts from a stranger.
- Immediately report any issue or problem you may have when going to or from school, to your mum and dad, or your teacher, the Principal, Assistant Principal or office staff.
- Always get permission from mum or dad before going to play with a friend after school and always let mum and dad know where you will be and what time you will be home.

We advise that wherever possible, children should travel to or from school with an adult or friends, rather than travel alone.

Working With Children Cards

Cardholders who are required to renew their WWCC will no longer need to go to Australia Post to lodge a paper form and present their current card. Cardholders will go to the WWCC website to complete their renewal application online and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the fee using a credit card when using the **online renewal process**, cardholders will be notified by SMS, letter or email 28 days before their WWCC is due to expire. It is important for cardholders to keep their contact details up to date so that they receive this important reminder.

After receiving a notification, individuals continuing to do child-related work should go to MyCheck on the WWCC website and apply to renew their check. Cardholders will be asked to register with MyCheck if they have not already done so. Once logged in to MyCheck, cardholders will be prompted to confirm or update their personal contact and work details, complete the online form and, if applying for an Employee Check, pay the non-refundable fee.

Bikes & Scooters

Many children ride bikes and scooters to school each day. All bikes and scooters must be locked up in either the Bike or Scooter Enclosure to prevent theft. Please ensure your child has a chain and a lock.

All children who ride a bike or scooter must wear a helmet which is a requirement by the Government. The school regularly reminds all children about wearing helmets for their safety.

All bikes, scooters, skateboards, ribstic and helmets must be labelled, with your child's name and class. **Children are reminded they must walk their bike, scooter, skateboard or ribstic to and from the school gates. No bikes are to be brought through the school buildings and we request, where possible, that scooters are also not walked through the building.**

Welcome to OSHClub Before, After School and Vacation Care (where applicable) provider

OSHClub works in partnership with Williamstown North Primary School to provide Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) services to the school community. We pride ourselves on providing children with fun, play based learning experiences. From exciting activities, healthy nutritious food, to caring motivated team members; the service meets all your children's needs.

What happens at OSHC?

We provide a range of activities for all ages including arts and crafts, games, sports, drama, board games, dress ups, cooking activities and fun social time with friends. On request from parents children can also participate in Homework Club. The service provides breakfast at Before School Care and afternoon tea at After School Care.

Our team

Your children are in the care of our qualified and experienced team members that have a current working with children's check and are trained in First Aid, CPR, Asthma and Anaphylaxis.

What to bring

Please ensure your children have appropriate and comfortable clothing and footwear, including a hat.

Where is the service located?

The OSHC service is located on site at Williamstown North Primary School. All children attending the service must be dropped off in the morning or collected in the afternoon by an authorised person and signed in and out of each session. Children in Year 1 and above can walk straight to/from their classrooms. OSHClub team members will pick up and drop off the Prep students, escorting them to the service.

How to enrol

An online OSHClub enrolment form must be completed via oshclub.com.au prior to your child's first attendance. Once enrolled with OSHClub, you will be required to log into your account and book the sessions you require.

Making or cancelling bookings

We offer permanent and casual bookings at the same affordable price to accommodate the needs of our families. Once enrolled, bookings can be made online at any time, up to 24 hours prior to the commencement of the session of care for Before and After School Care and up to 5 days prior for Vacation Care. Late bookings can be made by calling our Customer Service and Billing Team on **1300 395 735**. Bookings made within 24 hours will incur an extra charge of \$4.00 per session per child (excluding rebates). Vacation Care, bookings must be made 5 days in advance of session care commencement, or they will also incur an extra charge of \$4.00 per session.

Cancellations

48 hours' notice is required for cancellation of a before and after school booking and 7 days' notice is required for cancellation of a Vacation Care booking to ensure you will not incur out of pocket costs. Cancellations can be made through the following means:

- Online - Logging into your account at oshclub.com.au
- Phone - Contacting the Customer Service and Billing Team on **1300 395 735**
- Text - SMS to the Coordinator of the program. Include the following details to ensure your request can be processed:
 - Child's name e.g. Scott & Katie Smith; Service e.g. Example Primary School
 - Session and date you wish to cancel e.g. After School Care on 20 November 2018



Fees and session times

Many families are eligible for Child Care Subsidy, which reduces the out of pocket cost of school hours care. The following three key tests are used to determine the amount of subsidy for each family:

- Combined family annual adjusted taxable income - the percentage of subsidy a family will be entitled to will be based on their combined annual income.
- Activity test - the number of hours of subsidised child care that families will have access to per fortnight will be based on the activity level of both parents in the workforce or other recognised activity.
- Service Type - the type of child care service a family uses for child care.

To establish what level of CCS you may be entitled to please contact the Centrelink Family Line on 13 61 50.

The following table outlines the full fee with no subsidy, for one child, per session. Please use the '[Governments Estimator Website](#)' to obtain an estimate that is based on your individual details

The fees and rebate levels are subject to change each financial year and are based on the hours of operation as shown above. Child Care Subsidy is available on a sliding scale for families with a combined annual income of less than \$351K, subject to Centrelink Assessment.

Late pick-up fees of \$1 per minute per child may apply. If a child that is booked for a session does not attend, and no cancellation is provided, an additional 'No Show' Fee of \$5.00 will be charged (per child). Incursions and excursions during Vacation Care program incur an additional cost.

How to pay

Fees can be paid by credit card (VISA or MasterCard) or by direct debit from your nominated bank account. Your account will be automatically charged every two weeks for your attendance fees. As part of the online enrolment process, you will be required to complete an online iDebitPro Direct Debit form. Please note that a penalty fee will be charged by iDebitPro to your credit card or bank account if a transaction is declined.

Children will not be able to attend the service until all requested information or medication is provided.

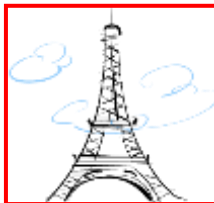

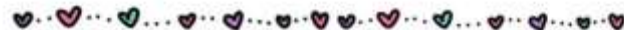
